I may not have all of the answers but together we can solve any issues that may arise.

Be sure to remember to file your 990 with the IRS prior to October 15, 2017. If your club needs an extension, you may file a Form 8868 by October 15 which will give you until January 15; you can also file for a second extension until April 15 if needed. When you've completed filing your club's 990, I ask that you forward to me a copy of your 990 confirmation acknowledgement that you will receive from the IRS when they receive your 990. Forward that IRS acknowledgement to me at preselect@aggienetwork.com. Filing your 990 with the IRS is quite possibly the MOST IMPORTANT FORM you will complete all year long. And it must be completed on time.

You will submit your **Form T** to me by **February 1, 2018**. More information regarding that form will be sent later in the year.



I'm Kathy Johnston, Past President of Austin Aggie Moms 2014-2016. Since my daughter gave me the gift of making me an Aggie Mom in 2011, I have been passionate about helping Aggie Moms clubs grow. Even better, our Aggies will be able to become \$100 - Bronze Level Century Club members for only \$25 additional dollars! Century Club members also receive a very nice wall plaque and a car decal.

In this way, we can help solidify our student's life-long connection to the Aggie Family. We can help them cultivate their personal legacy of giving back to A&M. We can be a part of helping our Aggies live out the Core Value of Loyalty. That's an excellent gift!
